

# Views of the Pacific 2008

## Summary

**O**ur tour starts in Puerto Vallarta in the Mexican state of Jalisco. We recommend flying into **Puerto Vallarta (PVR)** on the morning of, or before **Saturday November 15th** and back home from **Zihuatanejo-Ixtapa (ZIH)** on or after **Saturday November 29th**. Of course, you may prefer to come earlier or stay longer; let us know and we will make hotel reservations for you. Please note that you **MUST arrive in the morning on Saturday, or a day early** so that we can get your bike box shipped on to Zihua. **Alternatively**, you may choose to fly back out of PV, in which case your bike box need not be shipped, but you will have to add two days for the return bus trip and bicycle packing in PV. We urge you to book your flight as soon as possible.

**Y**ou will be responsible for taking a taxi from the airport to the hotel; **Hotel Azteca** at Madero 473; tel.: (322)222-2750. Once checked in you can unpack and reassemble your bike and we will either store your bike box at the hotel for your flight home, or help you ship it on to Zihuatanejo (the shipping must be done by Saturday afternoon, or else the box will have to stay behind in PV). On Saturday November 15<sup>th</sup> we will meet at **6pm** in our hotel lobby for our first group dinner and our tour orientation.

**O**ur route will take us from Puerto Vallarta, along a winding, hilly coastal road southeast to Zihuatanejo. Over our 11 days of riding we will average 71km daily and cover a total of about 779km. We will travel from the state of Jalisco, through the states of Colima and Michoacan and finally



into the state of Guerrero. Our daily rides will take us to various towns and cities including; El Tuito, Tomatlán, Punta Perula, Barra de Navidad, Manzanillo, Tecoman, La Placita, Maruata, Rio Nexpa, Playa Azul, Ixtapa and Zihuatanejo.

**A**t the end of the tour, on Saturday November 29<sup>th</sup>, you should disassemble and once again pack your bike in your bike box; ready for your flight home. Please allow plenty of time for the taxi ride to Zihuatanejo-Ixtapa international airport (ZIH).

**Alternatively**, you can take a first class overnight bus back to Puerto Vallarta, stay a night in PV where you can pack your bike, and then fly home on Monday December 1st.

**C**ount on a total of about US\$215 for accommodations (based on double occupancy); about US\$220 for food and drink; and about US\$150 for miscellaneous extras such as taxi, bus transportation, and entrance fees. Err on having a little extra and make sure to save a little money for souvenirs. Please note that in order to guarantee you a spot on the tour the guides' fee must be received by us no later than September 15<sup>th</sup>.

Day 8 Sun Nov 23, 2008	Tecoman to La Placita	60 km	Into Michoacan and the start of the great views and more challenging cycling. Small-Town Real Mexico. Beach.
Day 9 Mon Nov 24, 2008	La Placita to Maruata	50 km	More beach. Very Quiet, Scenic, Hilly, Curvy Roads. Spectacular Views of the Ocean. Small Towns.

Day 11 Wed Nov 26, 2008	Maruata to Playa Rio Nexpa	96 km	Incredibly Quiet Roads - Challenging Climbs, Rewarding Views of Ocean and Mountains. One of the most spectacular sections of Mexico. Small Towns. Surfer Beaches.
