

Yucatan One Week Tour 2011

Summary

Our tour starts in **Valladolid** in the Mexican state of Yucatan. We recommend flying into **Mérida** or **Cancun** on or before **Sunday February 6th** and back home on or after **Sunday February 13th**. You will have to travel from the airport for another 2 to 3 hours, either by 1st class bus or by more expensive airport transfer/taxi to Valladolid where the tour starts. Of course you may also prefer to arrive earlier or stay longer; let us know and we will make hotel reservations for you. We urge you to book your flight as soon as possible.

We can help you with the details, but you will be responsible for getting yourself to the hotel in **Valladolid**; **Hotel Don Luis** at Calle 39 #191, tel.: (985)856-2024. Once checked in you can unpack and reassemble your bikes and we will store your bike boxes at the hotel for your flight home. On Sunday February 6th, in the evening we will meet at **6pm** in the hotel lobby for a group dinner and tour orientation.

Our route will take us from Valladolid, south-east to Coba, and looping up to Ek Balam, Izamal, Pisté (Chichen Itza) and finally back to Valladolid. Over our 5 days of riding we will average 80km daily and cover a total of about 402km. We will travel mostly in the state of Yucatan and briefly in Quintana Roo.



On the last day of the tour, Saturday February 12th, we ride back into Valladolid. You will have some time to explore this beautiful colonial city. Later you should disassemble and once again pack your bike in your bike box; ready for your flight home the next day (Sunday February 13th) or later if you are staying longer. Please take into account the time it will take to bus back to Cancun or Merida to catch your flight, and allow plenty of time for the taxi ride back to the airport.

Count on a total of about US\$110 for accommodations (based on double occupancy); about US\$95 for food and drink; and about US\$120 for miscellaneous extras such as taxi, bus transportation, and entrance fees. Err on having a little extra and make sure to save a little money for souvenirs.

Please note that in order to guarantee you a spot on the tour, the outstanding balance of the guides' fee must be received by us no later than December 6th.

Day 4 Thurs Feb 10, 2011	Izamal	-	Mayan Ruins, huge pyramid, Convent, Zocalo, Market, beautiful Izamal, the best tacos in Mexico!
Day 5 Fri Feb 11, 2011	Izamal to Pisté (via Stilpech, Tunkas and Dzitas)	71 km	Cenotes, quiet roads, small towns
Day 6 Sat Feb 12, 2011	Pisté to Valladolid (via Dzitas, Tinum, Uayma)	59 km	Chichén-Itzá ruins, caves, cenotes, colonial town
